Brother Uli is one of the first brothers in Russia. He met Maksim at the hospital in Omsk where he had come for treatment of some illness. He received the gospel with eagerness, but in all seriousness, he knew that if he were to follow Jesus it would mean drastic changes for his life.

Upon returning home and after great meditation, more study and reflection, he wrote Maksim a letter that he wanted to commit his life to following Jesus and be baptized. He chose to give up his former lifestyle of alcohol abuse and smoking and was

willing to strive to live a biblical lifestyle walking in faith.

When Maksim went to baptize him, in a very small village in northern Siberia, his wife, Tamara, made Maksim sleep in a shed and she wasn't interested in her husband's faith. She didn't believe he was really serious about changing after living with him for so many years.

Praise God she saw the changes and saw that Uli's faith was real, and the next year we gained a sister! Since their lives had changed for the better, they decided to move in with her mother in an apartment in the city, where their daughter Lena also lived.

Unfortunately, not long after moving to town, Sister Tamara died in a car accident and Lena was severely injured. As a result of Tamara's death and Lena becoming bedridden, Tamara's mother had a stroke and also became bedridden. Uli says that without his faith after this tragedy, he would have returned to alcohol, but with God's strength and grace he is able to overcome and be strong for his family.

Brother Uli has had one tragedy after another. Last year he was diagnosed with a brain tumor, but instead of blaming God and losing his faith, he rejoices that he has God to help him through all these hard things in life. He has said that without God he would have been long dead. He is grateful for brethren around the world who are praying for him and he says how blessed he is to have Maksim to talk to him and strengthen him in word and spirit.

Today Uli is in the hospital for more treatment. He is struggling, but he prays for more time with his daughter and mother-in-law and hopes that they too will trust in God as he has. He hopes that he will be able to see Maksim one more time before he dies, Lord willing this spring. His faith has not wavered and his hope is in the resurrection.

PLEASE PRAY for strength and healing for Brother Uli and that his family would repent and be baptized and cling to the same hope and have the same peace that he knows, and that Tamara knew, once he is gone. Please pray for the finances to come in for the airfare for Maksim to travel there once winter is over. They do not know if Uli will be around come this summer when Maksim usually travels to visit the scattered brethren.

PRAISE GOD for the transformation of this life and that, due to your past generosity, their relatives have stepped up to help with those that are bedridden so that Uli could go to the hospital. The money that bought airline tickets not only got Maksim there to encourage Uli, but also opened the door to share more with Uli's family and it convicted the relatives to step up and help since a complete stranger was willing to come such a distance to help. To God be the glory!

It is wonderful what God's people can do to help change lives for eternity! Thank you for being a part of such a transformation! What an amazing party it will be when we sit down to the table with Jesus and all the brethren!

I hope that these stories have encouraged and inspired you as they do me. May we continue to sow seeds as faithful servants and reap a little of the joy that we will know when Jesus returns and we see the full harvest of our efforts!
