

1. The best way to identify a lie is to be very familiar with the truth.
2. When we fail to exclusively respect the truth, we open the door for untruth.
3. Beware of half-truth. You may have gotten hold of the wrong half.
4. Half-truths are worse than blatant lies. People hear a little truth, recognize it, and then assume the rest is true as well.
5. More truth is found when digging for facts than when jumping to conclusions.
6. When a man who is honestly mistaken hears the truth, he either ceases to be mistaken, or he ceases to be honest, or he's been seriously fooled!
7. Truth is not always popular, but it is always right!
8. When you add to the truth, you subtract from it.
9. Anytime you find that truth stands in your way, you may be sure that you are headed in the wrong direction.
10. One cannot consistently live a lifestyle that is inconsistent with personal values, without rejecting those values.
11. If 50 million people say a foolish thing, it is still a foolish thing. Truth is never dependent upon consensus of opinion.
12. Those who think it is permissible to tell white lies soon grow color blind.
13. Always speak the truth and you'll never have to worry about your memory.
14. Truth can never be threatened by examination, only reconfirmed.
15. If a lie is told often enough, or loudly enough, it will be accepted and believed.
16. If one is not willing to *die* for a truth, there should remain a willingness for further study. If one *is* willing to die for it, he should be teaching and sharing it. – Tracy Savage
17. Right is right even if nobody's doing it. Wrong is wrong even if everybody's doing it.
18. A text without a context is just a pretext.
19. Fight truth decay; study the Bible daily!
20. They perish because they refused to love the truth and so be saved. For this reason God sends them a powerful delusion so that they will believe the lie and so that all will be condemned who have not believed the truth but have delighted in wickedness. The Apostle Paul
21. If you have truthfully told only part of the story to intentionally leave a false impression, you have been dishonest.
22. The weaker the argument, the stronger and sometimes the louder the words.
23. Men occasionally stumble over the truth, but most of them pick themselves up and hurry off as if nothing ever happened. Winston Churchill
24. Don't rely on your emotions for God's revelation. Look in the scriptures. Chuck Swindoll
25. Truth is never determined by the volume of the voice. Chinese Proverb
26. Some handle truth very carefully. Others never touch it at all.
27. Two Rules for Bible Interpretation
 - a. Difficult or obscure passages must always be interpreted and understood in light of more clear verses on the same topic.
 - b. The scriptures are the very best interpreter of scripture.
28. Four Tests For Determining Truth
 - a. Is there a Biblical basis for the teaching?
 - b. Is the teaching based on just one or a few unclear passages?
 - c. Is the interpretation consistent with the rest of scripture?
 - d. Does the teaching go against reason or logic?
