They went to Margarita's relative's house in a small town outside of the city. The elderly man lives alone and there was room for the four of them, and he was interested in listening in on their discussions. Maksim also helped him around the yard as needed and the ladies helped him around the house.

They spent a little over a week there and then sister Ksenia went home. The other three went back to Margarita's house for several more weeks. Margarita's husband says he's a communist and not interested in religion, but he is happy with her changes and that she is kinder and doesn't nag or yell at him as before.

It was such a blessing for Ksenia to meet the other sisters, and now she has that connection.

Then Maksim was blessed to take an eight-hour bus ride to meet with our new brother Ivan and his young daughter Nina that he had met online in one of his Unitarian groups. After about three years of conversation and study, and only one week before Maksim left to visit the sisters, Ivan called and told him that he had repented and wanted to be baptized. What a joy for Maksim after cultivating that seed in Ivan for so long!



Ivan is from the Ukraine. They met at an elderly relative's home in Tobolsk who also enjoyed hearing their biblical discussions. (Praise God that even more seeds were sown!) Ivan and Nina had just moved to Russia after another relative had secured a job in the mines for him in Siberia. The political unrest and the civil war in the Ukraine that had killed his wife was too much for a single father. Nina's mother was killed when she was out walking in town with Nina, then only a few months old. Gunfire broke out and unfortunately, she was caught in the middle.



After much discussion, Ivan was baptized and Maksim spent another week or so with them, building Ivan up in the faith and teaching him more about what the Bible has to say on the core teachings of Jesus and how a follower of Christ should live and act in the world. They discussed prophesy and how we are citizens of God's coming kingdom. Due to the world issues and politics, they looked at what the Bible had to say on patriotism and a Christian's involvement in the world's government. Maksim reminded Ivan that all the world's government have changed and over the past 2000 years many great world powers have risen and fallen and only God's

government will remain forever. He told him how the early

Christians thirsted for Jesus' return and the establishment of God's government.

As Maksim spoke on forgiveness and how he must choose to forgive his wife's assassins and not desire revenge, Ivan confessed how that was God speaking to his heart and using Maksim to help him heal and have peace. Ivan agreed that hatred was like poison in you and that you must release it. He was so grateful for this wisdom! He felt that they were the very words from God that he needed to hear.

The One God internet group where Maksim met Ivan now has over 74,000 members! Maksim commented that he had read an



article where Kent Ross said that his dream for Church of God, Faith of Abraham, was to be as wellknown as Mormons and Jehovah Witnesses as a result of their evangelism efforts. Maksim is well on his way to making this dream come true!
