
Theological Conference 2019

Maksim safely returned from baptizing brother Yevgeni, but unfortunately, he didn't get much sleep on his way home since the others in his compartment were drinking and loud all night. Although exhausted, Maksim continued to minister to those in need.

When Maksim first met Constantine, he was in the hospice ward at the hospital where Maksim volunteers and not really open to much religious talk. The death of his wife about ten years ago, however, prompted him to begin searching for God. In his search for truth, he found that he didn't like the protestant churches and so instead he went to the Russian Orthodox Church. But there he was unsatisfied and still looking for something. He told Maksim later that it was his kindness and genuine care that opened him up to hear the truth and find peace in his future.

Maksim and Constantine talked and studied for about a month and a half until Maksim left to baptize brother Yevgeni. While Maksim was away, the relatives took Constantine home to die. (Most likely the reason was to keep him from giving his apartment to someone else. They wanted to protect their inheritance.) As he told Maksim, they are over him like hawks, but not in a caring way and there seems to be some harsh treatment. Please pray for peace for Constantine, a miracle of healing, and that he would repent and turn to God before he dies.

When Maksim returned, Constantine asked him to come over to his apartment. When Maksim arrived, the relatives met him outside the door and hurled profanities at him and told him to leave. One guy hit him in the head. He told them he was just there by Constantine's request as a spiritual friend and he didn't want to cause any problems, and he left.

Constantine was concerned that if he repented but couldn't get baptized,

He had taken a bus from Kazakhstan and then was in a group "taxi" traveling the rest of the way. A little outside his destination the car got in a bad accident. Praise the Lord he escaped with just a broken hand. The others in the car were much worse off.

After a night in the hospital the two men took a five-hour bus ride to Yevgeni's aunt's apartment Tobolsk. She was out of town for three days so they stayed there and when she returned Maksim moved to a hotel for another night. The two men then returned together on the bus before parting ways.

While they were together Yevgeni wanted to spend a lot of time going through the Bible and through all of the errors that the Jehovah's Witnesses teach.

He was very grateful that Maksim was able to baptize him and that they could spend that time together.
