also continues to bless them personally. We cannot outgive God. And all we have to give, is His in the first place.

If God gives us opportunities, we better take them and run. If we don't, He will give them to someone that He can trust to do His work, and we will miss the blessing and the pleasure of serving the God of the universe!

As a Christian, our foundation is Jesus; but as it says, at the resurrection of the righteous, our works and service will be tested by fire. We may enter the kingdom with immortality, but with little reward beyond that. We are encouraged to build on the foundation with things that will last, things that will make it through the fire - PEOPLE.

Another amazing truth is that together we sow and harvest. As it is written, if someone gives a glass of cold water to a servant on the front lines, he too will receive the servant's reward. If you are in the mission fields or if you are providing money and prayers for God's work in the fields, each one will receive the same reward and each sacrifice honors the Father and His Messiah!

Lastly, to whom much has been given, much is required. If we are faithful servants, we must seek to know what God requires of us. It isn't difficult, but as we see with the rich young ruler, it may cause us sorrow if we are blessed financially.

God does not expect a brother in Malawi to donate money for Bibles in Russia or help fund or even go on a mission trip to Peru. But he is expected to be faithful with the Good News he has, and he can pray for others as they give and go.

Americans and other first world Christians have the opportunity for more financial wealth to use for the kingdom. Like the verse says, more is expected and required of those who have more. Those born in these "wealthy" nations are not any better than the brethren born into a third world nation, but they are blessed to be in a position to sow bountifully and give generously. They have the responsibility to support the ministries and missionaries and help our less financially fortunate brethren around the world (and at home as well.)

Instead on having a scarcity mindset, we must think abundantly and rejoice when another need arises to do ministry and share the Gospel of the Kingdom. This is a blessing, not a burden! Rejoice that more Bibles are needed because there is opportunity to hand them out! Rejoice that pastors are meeting with each other to be encouraged in ministry and to sharpen each other as iron sharpens iron! Rejoice that one desires to minister to people in a village farther away and needs a bicycle or motorcycle to get there. Rejoice that there is another building needing to be built for the church to meet in rather than under a tree. Rejoice that there is one more language to translate biblical material into! Get excited over a ministry need, not discouraged that we must to raise more money! This means that God is working and He considers you worthy to put your hand to the plow and help in the fields that are ripe.

The ministry and the money are God's. He could do everything Himself if He wanted, but as we see throughout Scripture, He chooses to use His people. Jesus did the work and he passed the baton onto us, his church. Will you take it and run the race set before you? Will you be faithful with what God has given you? Ask Him why He blessed you and what He wants you to do and how He wants you to use the seed He has given you.
